

Wolves top scorer Ebanks-Blake then had a chance from the 18 yard box but a fine save from Basso kept it at 2-0.

The conditions got worse, heavy rain and wind, made it harder for the 22 men on the pitch.

Bristol City worked hard and battled the conditions and got their reward when the strike force linked. Maynard's inch perfect pass left Adebola with a chance on the edge of the six yard box a left footed drive beat Hennessey at the front post and city had found a way back into the game.

The next clear cut chance fell to Jarvis a left footed shot across goal needed a touch wide from Basso.

City then had a chance to level but Maynard's curling shot went just beyond the far post. City were giving 110% and had the full backing of the 12th man. Maynard then had another chance but blazed just over.

Wolves had a brief spell and scored but a handball was rightly spotted by the officials meaning the goal didn't stand.

And then with three minutes to go Mcindoes line ball found Adebola who shrugged off Stearman and dribbled into the box before squaring the ball past the onrushing Hennessey to his strike partner Maynard who was calm and composed and placed the ball in the bottom corner 2-2. City had fought the elements, odds and a two goal deficit to rescue a point. Adebolas contribution was recognised by picking up man of the match.
