

I was at a lively Memorial Stadium tonight and watched Rover's overcome a Yeovil side who looked like they were missing Russell Slade massively. Rover's had the best chances throughout the game, scoring 3 of their 5 shots on target. That said, Yeovil didn't wilt over and die, with them having more possession and shots in the game.

David Pipe open the scoring with a determined volley in the box, after some link up play from Duffy and Kuffour.

Yeovil looked shaky and lacked structure, this clearly due to the recent departure of their manager Russell Slade, who before tonight took Yeovil on a 4 game winning streak with 3 clean sheets.

Rover's played some solid football and definitely played with some drive as they pushed Yeovil aside to move up to 13th in League 1, having taken 6 points in 6.

Rover's now have to look towards the big challenge that faces them at home against Leicester on Saturday and with Leicester out of form at the moment, we could see Rover's cause another upset in Leicester's promotion push.
